# **CELEBRATE INDEPENDENCE!**



Great Britain. After 86 changes to the draft, the Continental Congress adopted the final version on July 4, 1776. Thus began the codification of freedom in our country. The Revolutionary War ended in 1783, and the US Constitution came into force in 1789. The 13-15<sup>th</sup> Amendments (1865-1870) granted freedom and citizenship to black Americans (Vermont outlawed slavery in 1777, before becoming the 14<sup>th</sup> state in 1791). The 19<sup>th</sup> Amendment (1920) granted women full voting rights. Today, communities across the nation mark this history with parades, firework displays, picnics, and performances of "The Star-Spangled Banner."



# **MEET A FRIENDLY NEIGHBOR**

Born and raised in greater Boston, **Nori Geary** is a Vermonter by choice, not birth.

My Vermont experience began in my 20s. After college and a tour in the Navy, I spent winter 1971-72 in Stowe ski bumming, working first at Trapp's then at the Mountaineer. After that, I worked for a while on a dairy farm in Arlington, VT. In the fall, I left Vermont to enter graduate school, preparing for a research career in behavioral neuroscience. After my PhD, I won a fellowship for study in Munich, Germany, where I spent two wonderful years.



I then moved to New York City, first as a fellow at Cornell Medical College then as a faculty member at Columbia University. My wife and I bought a small getaway house in Arlington, VT, on the Battenkill River—canoeing joined hiking and skiing as our hobbies. After 10 years at Columbia, I returned to Cornell, where I spent the next 15 years. In 2004, I had the opportunity to move to the Swiss Federal Institute of Technology in Zurich, Switzerland, where we lived for 13 years. My research career focused on neural and hormonal controls of appetite and body weight, mainly in animal models. It was rewarding and, I hope, useful.

After I retired, we decided in 2016 to move back to the USA (thinking that Hillary Clinton would be president). I suggested to my wife, Lori, who is also a scientist and not yet retired, that she find a job at UVM so we could live near Burlington—ideally someplace with cross-country skiing out the door. Everything, except the

election, worked out well, and we moved to Underhill in 2017.

I learned from my neighbors in Switzerland that most towns there have a variety of community-sponsored programs for older folks, run by volunteers and social workers hired by the towns. This seemed to be an excellent scheme, so when a neighbor here told me about the fledgling Mount Mansfield Villages, I decided to volunteer and am happy that I did.



It takes a village to help older adults stay in their homes, live independently, and remain connected. Mount Mansfield Villages (MMV) is a nonprofit, membership organization formed to provide a supportive village for residents of Cambridge, Underhill, & Jericho.

# REMEMBER WHEN UNDERHILL...

Marion Gleason's house was on Route 15 beside the fire station. After she died (at the age of 103!), the fire department purchased the property, took down the house, and built the current fire station there.

Uzzel Whitcomb lived where Steve Guay is today, on River Road. The intersection with Park Street would be in the far distance.





The Mansfield Inn was across the road from the post office in Underhill Center. It had been the Prouty Hotel and was for many years a stopping point for people coming to hike up Mount Mansfield.



Camp Mansfield, a summer camp operated by Mrs. Helene Durbrow from 1946 to 1963 on the Mountain Road, was for children with learning difficulties, helping them to not lose any abilities over the summer, while at the same time giving them a full camping experience, including horseback riding, swimming, hiking, archery, overnight camping, and nature study.




David Gallup carried on his father's hardware store and tin shop on Park Street for many years. As the hardware business was taken over by larger chain stores, David turned to making copper dippers and lamps, which were very popular.

Effie's Lunch was in a house beside the Underhill Garage, later demolished to form a parking lot. It was a lunch counter and bus stop (when Vermont Transit buses ran from Burlington to Morrisville). Effie's husband, Charlie Reynolds, operated a tailor shop there and also brought the mail from the railroad station to the post office (when it was in the next house north of the brick store) on a hand cart.
